## JR-SR HIGH SCHOOL

First of all welcome back to the 2009-2010 school year. I will continue this year with my weekly parent emails, to communicate important events, great news items and bits of information to parents in grades 7th-12th. Please email me if you want additional email addresses or changes added to my database.

Reading: Our secondary building's reading scores on ITEDs and ITBS dropped significantly last year so we are focusing heavily on reading this year in our building. We will be doing DEAR (Drop Everything And Read) in Connections regularly. In addition we have had several staff members get trained in a special reading program called Second Chance Reading and we have identified students that we will be delivering this reading program to.

Now let me put on my Superintendent hat and address the Revenue Purpose Statement which will be an issue to vote upon during the up-

coming September 8 election.

#### Revenue Purpose Statement

In addition to our regular school board elections on September 8th we will also have a special election included on the ballot. This issue is a vote on the Revenue Purpose Statement that authorizes expenditures of the Local Option Sales Tax funds. We also call this the penny sales tax funds. The last few years Southeast Warren has used the income off of this special revenue to tackle many special projects in our school ranging from purchasing of school buses and technology equipment to repair and/or upgrading of our school buildings. The school board has outlined a plan spanning over 5 years of how these dollars will be utilized.

This vote will neither add nor rescind any tax. A one-cent local option sales tax has been in place for several years in Warren County and was voted in by the residents of the

county. Many schools surrounding us have already voted in a new Revenue Purpose Statement and with the pending school board elections it is time to do the same at Southeast Warren.

Recent legislation has changed the Local Option Sales Tax to a State-Wide One-Cent Sales Tax that will sunset in 2029. The name for this tax is the State of Iowa Secure an Advanced Vision for Education (SAVE) Fund. Each school district must pass a revenue purpose statement that will authorize the school to make expenditures in the areas allowed by the law and will continue to be a source of property tax relief.

The revenue purpose statement, as it will appear on the ballot, is provided below. The language of this revenue purpose statement is the language we must use as a guide to what we can or cannot use the funds for.

## Revenue Purpose Statement

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 423F.3, Code of Iowa, the Southeast Warren Community School District hereby adopts and submits to the Commissioner of Elections of Warren County, Iowa, this Revenue Purpose Statement to be submitted to the electors at an election to be held September 8, 2009.

Money received by the Southeast Warren Community School District from the State of Iowa Secure an Advanced Vision for Education Fund may be spent for any one or more of the following purposes:

- To provide funds for property tax relief.
- To provide funds to build and furnish a new school facility or facilities; to build and furnish addition(s) to school facilities; to remodel, repair, expand, and improve the school buildings in the District;

to purchase and improve grounds; for demolition work; to furnish and equip district facilities.

- To provide funds for the purchase, lease or lease-purchase of buildings or equipment (including transportation, technology and recreation equipment) as authorized by law, to implement and install energy conservation measures, sharing or rental of facilities, procuring or acquisition of libraries, or opening roads to schoolhouses or buildings.
- To provide funds for emergency repairs to respond to natural disasters, such as fire, wind damage, flood; to repair, improve, and/or replace mechanical, plumbing, structural, roof, and electrical system; environmental remediation; or to respond to changes in demographics

that require construction of additions or improvements to school buildings or new school buildings.

- To provide funds to establish and maintain public recreation places and playgrounds; or for community education purposes; and other authorized expenditures and purposes as now or hereafter permitted by law and designated by the Southeast Warren Community School District.
- To provide funds for the payment of principal and interest or retirement of general obligation bonds issued for school infrastructure purposes, energy improvement loans, loan agreements authorized by Iowa Code section 297.36, sales, service and use tax revenue bonds issued under Iowa Code section 423E.5.

Welcome back! Please join us between 6:00 and 7:00 p.m. on September 1st at the Primary building for our annual back-to-school open house. Cookies from the lunchroom and a cold drink from PIE will be served in the main office foyer. We hope to see you there!

Over the summer we experienced the loss of two staff members - reading specialist Myrissa Gingerich and elementary guidance counselor Tim Babcock. Myrissa has taken a kindergarten job nearer her parents' home, and Tim is the new counselor at Whittier Elementary in Indianola. In addition, Cynthia DeJoode has transferred from the preschool position to a newly organized reading specialist/ resource room teacher position in our building.

Last month we introduced our new kindergarten teacher Sara Flaws and our new preschool teacher Erin Weaver to you. This month I would like to introduce our new elementary guidance counselor - Nicholas Lindell. Nicholas comes to us from Bayfield, Wisconsin. He is a graduate of Gustavus Adolphus College in St. Peter, Wisconsin, where he earned his B.A., majoring in psychology and minoring in music, and

the University of Wisconsin in Platteville, where he earned his master's degree in PK-12 school counseling. While Nick is new to counseling, he has worked with special needs students as a classroom paraprofessional and has substitute taught in grades first through nine. In his spare time, Nick is a professional musician. As with Mr. Babcock, we will be sharing Nick with the Melcher-Dallas Community Schools. Nick will be in the Primary building all day on Mondays and on Friday afternoons, in the Intermediate building all day on Thursdays and on Friday mornings, and in Melcher-Dallas all day on Tuesdays and Wednesdays. We have found our new staff to be enthusiastic, skilled at what they do, and very caring of the students.

I would like to take this opportunity to invite all of the elementary parents to our first, reorganizational Partners in Education meeting, which will be held in the Primary workroom on September 21st at 6:00 p.m. Please consider joining this important parent-teacher group to share your ideas and help us make our school the best it can be.

## IDM Begins Second Year

Instructional Decision Making (IDM) is a problem-solving model used by both elementary buildings to enhance reading proficiency. Student data is used to determine reading group placement so that students are placed in instructional groups to match his or her reading needs. IDM groups address skill levels from those with deficit reading skills to those with advanced reading skills.

Each grade level will have several instructional groups, designed so that students may move into or out of reading groups as his or her skill level indicates changes are needed. The reading groups are in addition to the general education reading instruction that all students receive. Those students identified with special education needs get specially designed reading instruction in addition to the general education instruction and the reading group instruction.

All student data will be evaluated by the whole IDM reading team at three different data days scheduled for September 30th, February 10th, and May 12th. In addition to the data days, there will be monthly IDM team meetings to monitor progress and made additional adjustments as necessary.

The teachers will also participate in professional development activities that focus on beefing up the core reading instruction in the areas of vocabulary and fluency instruction. Instructional materials and teaching strategies are research-based in order to match the best materials with the instructional need.

Parents can support the reading program by listening to his or her student read out loud.

**July 13, 2009**

The Southeast Warren Board of Education met in regular session July 13, 2009, in the media center of the Junior/Senior High School Building. Board President Paul Mead called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. The following board members were present: Jennifer Mihalovich, Marianne Lester and Ron Miller. Larrie Williams arrived at 5:35 p.m. Superintendent/Secondary Principal Delane Galvin, Intermediate Principal Dan Dow, Transportation Director Joel Mosher and Board Secretary Julie Wilson were also in attendance, along with members from the community.

**AGENDA:** Motion by Ron Miller, seconded by Jennifer Mihalovich to approve the agenda. Ayes: 4. (Larrie Williams was absent from the vote.)

**REPORTS:**

Transportation Report submitted by Joel Mosher:

We had 40 extra bus trips for the month of June. I spent time assisting Howard in the building and mowing as needed. I went through all busses and checked over for repairs that are needed. The rest of the month was spent doing general repairs.

**CONSENT AGENDA:** The following items were on the consent agenda:

1. June 8, 2009 minutes
2. Financial reports

Motion by Jennifer Mihalovich, seconded by Ron Miller to approve the items on the consent agenda. Ayes: 4. (Larrie Williams was absent from the vote.)

**SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT:** Superintendent Galvin reported on the following items:

1. The softball girls will be playing their third round of regionals against Molten-Udell.
2. District baseball will be against Melcher-Dallas tomorrow night.
3. The cheerleaders have been invited to participate in an activity with the Kansas City Chiefs cheerleaders. The cheerleaders would spend the night and then perform during half time of a pre-season football game. This item will be brought back to the Board in August for approval.
4. Work is continuing on student schedules. An option may be added for early bird P.E. in order to have enough offerings of P.E. during the day.
5. There may be an opportunity to partner with Simpson College for a grant that would provide funding for professional development in the area of teacher instruction in the classroom.

6. A late-filed open enrollment application has been received and will be brought to the Board in August.

7. Summer custodial work is progressing very well. The custodians are either at or ahead of schedule.

8. Packets were given to board members up for election in September.

**OPEN POSITIONS/GUIDANCE/BAND:** Superintendent Galvin related to the Board that interviews would be held on Friday for the Elementary Guidance position. A recommendation will be included in personnel changes for the Media Specialist position. The High School Guidance and Band positions will remain the same as last year.

**PERSONNEL CHANGES:** Superintendent Galvin recommended accepting the resignations of Andrea DeWitt, HS Language Arts; Myrissa Gingerich, Elementary Instructor; and Chuck Jones, JH Baseball Coach; approving the termination of the contract for Judy Dittmer, Special Education Bus Driver; approving the appointments of Chuck Jones, Head HS Baseball Coach; Chris Morrow, Co-Head HS Girls' Basketball Coach; Zeb Birchett, Volunteer Assistant HS Football Coach; Jane Nady, One-on-One Special Education Associate; Courtney Johnson, Sign Language Interpreter; Carrie Cooper, Drill Team Coach; Megan Weeks, Head Speech Coach; and Kim Heim, Assistant Athletic Director; and approving the contract modifications for Megan Weeks, increase contract from 87.5% to 100%; Erin Jensen, increase contract from 63% to 90% for additional Media Specialist duties; Mike Tierney, change contract from Dean of Students/Guidance Counselor Duties to Dean of Students/Counselor Duties/Teacher/Data Coach; Chuck Jones, increase Athletic Director contract from 9% to 12%; and Kim Carnes, increase from 7 ½ hours per day to 8 hours per day for the addition of technology duties. Motion by Ron Miller, seconded by Larrie Williams to approve the personnel changes as presented. Ayes: 4. Jennifer Mihalovich abstained from voting.

**CERTIFIED & CLASSIFIED EMPLOYEE HANDBOOKS:** Superintendent Galvin recommended approval of the updated Certified and Classified Employee Handbooks. Motion by Jennifer Mihalovich, seconded by Marianne Lester to approve the Certified and Classified Employee Handbooks. Ayes: 5.

**OPEN ENROLLMENT APPLICATION:** Superintendent Galvin related to the Board that an open enrollment application had been received for Sawyer Steenhoek for the 2009-2010 school year to open enroll into Southeast Warren from Chariton. Superintendent Galvin recommended approving the open enrollment application. Mo-

tion by Larrie Williams, seconded by Marianne Lester to approve the open enrollment application for Sawyer Steenhoek. Ayes: 5.

**ADMISSION PRICES FOR 2009-2010:** Superintendent Galvin related to the Board that the Pride of Iowa Conference is asking for each district to vote on an increase to admission prices from \$4 for adults and \$3 for students to \$5 for adults and \$3 for students. Motion by Ron Miller, seconded by Jennifer Mihalovich to approve increasing admission prices to \$5 per adult and \$3 per student and to leave the price of activity passes the same. Ayes: 5.

**STUDENT FEES FOR 2009-2010:** Superintendent Galvin recommended increasing student fees by \$5. Book rent is currently \$50 per student and 3-year-old preschool fees are \$16 per month. Motion by Ron Miller, seconded by Larrie Williams to increase the book rent fee to \$55 and increase preschool fees to \$20. Aye: 5.

**FIVE-YEAR EXPENDITURE PLAN:** Superintendent Galvin recommended approving the updated Five-Year Expenditure Plan for facilities, transportation, and technology as discussed at the last board meeting. Motion by Jennifer Mihalovich, seconded by Ron Miller to approve the Five-Year Expenditure Plan. Ayes: 5.

**SEARCH FOR ARCHITECT OR ENGINEER:** Superintendent Galvin requested permission from the Board to seek bids for an architect or engineer as part of the process for projects on the Five-Year Expenditure Plan. Motion by Larrie Williams, seconded by Marianne Lester to approve the search for an architect or engineer. Ayes: 5.

**CONTRACT MODIFICATION WITH DR. PEPPER:** Superintendent Galvin recommended approving a contract modification with Dr. Pepper to allow products from other vendors to be sold. Motion by Jennifer Mihalovich, seconded by Ron Miller to approve the contract modification with Dr. Pepper. Ayes: 5.

**SHARING AGREEMENT WITH MELCHER-DALLAS:** Superintendent Galvin recommended approving a sharing agreement with Melcher-Dallas School District to share Physical Education one day a week. Mr. Tierney will be teaching the shared Physical Education class. Motion by Larrie Williams, seconded by Ron Miller to approve the sharing agreement with Melcher-Dallas for Physical Education. Ayes: 5.
